

The entire villa has been faithfully reconstructed as a fully functional complex - the only example of its kind anywhere in the world. The villa's baths, tavern, the manor house with its museum, the residential and farm buildings, the gardens, the gatehouse building and the Roman kitchen have all been faithfully recreated.
